#### **Answers and Explanation:**

• 1. Answer: C) 10

Explanation: One hand has 5 fingers, so two hands have 5 + 5 = 10 fingers.

• 2. Answer: C) 8

Explanation: The number that follows 7 in counting is 8.

• **3. Answer:** B) 2

Explanation: Start with 4 cookies and subtract the 2 you eat: 4 - 2 = 2.

• 4. Answer: B) Rock

*Explanation*: In general, a rock is heavier than a feather, making this a simple comparison for young students.

• **5. Answer:** B) 3

Explanation: A triangle is a shape with exactly 3 sides.

• **6. Answer:** C) 5

Explanation: Adding 3 and 2 gives 3 + 2 = 5.

• **7. Answer:** C) Tuesday

Explanation: The day after Monday is Tuesday.

• **8. Answer:** C) 4

Explanation: A cat typically has 4 legs.

• 9. Answer: C) Circle

*Explanation:* A ball appears as a round shape, which is a circle in two dimensions, appropriate for Grade 1 understanding.

• 10. Answer: B) 5

Explanation: Comparing 5 and 3, 5 is the larger number.

• **11. Answer:** C) 4

Explanation: A square has 4 corners, one at each vertex.

• **12. Answer:** C) 3

Explanation: Add the balloons: 2 red + 1 blue = 3 balloons.

• **13. Answer:** B) 4

Explanation: Subtract 1 from 5:5-1=4.

• 14. Answer: B) Rabbit

Explanation: A rabbit is generally faster than a turtle, a fun comparison for kids.

• **15. Answer:** B) 2

Explanation: A bicycle has 2 wheels.
